Item Description: Receive Update on COVID-19 and Impact on City Operations

#### 1 BACKGROUND

- 2 On March 13, 2020, Governor Walz declared a statewide peacetime emergency due to the COVID-
- 19 pandemic. On March 16, 2020, Mayor Roe declared a local emergency due to the COVID-19
- 4 pandemic and the City Council extended the local emergency until May 15, 2020. On May 11, the
- 5 City Council extended the local emergency until such time Governor Walz rescinds the state
- 6 emergency and the City Council passes a resolution to rescind the local emergency. As the scope of
- 7 changes as a result of COVID-19 have mostly been implemented and there is not a significant
- 8 change on a week-by-week basis, staff will provide the City Council and the public an update
- 9 regarding the effect of COVID-19 in our community and its impact on city operations once a month.
- More frequent updates will occur if conditions change.

#### 14 **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS**



  - Park shelters and park buildings are available for reservation to groups adhering to required size limitations and social distancing guidelines
  - ☐ Cedarholm Golf Course, including patio and Acorn Disc Golf Course are open
  - Roseville Skating Center open for ice rental groups and summer skate school
  - Skating Center banquet rooms for groups that adhere to the group size for indoor assembly
  - ☐ Harriet Alexander Nature Center



# 2020 Economic Development Activities COVID-19 Relief

#### CITY PROGRAMS - CARES ACT FUNDS

#### **Residential Relief Program**

- Total applications = 40
- Approved = 15
- Denied/not eligible = 6
- In process = 19
- 39 additional applications were received last week that are still being reviewed
- Total grant funds administered = \$23,853
- Per grant average = \$1,590

#### **Business Relief Program**

- Total applications = 90
- Approved = 30
- Denied/not eligible = 6
- Complete/Pending Approval = 1
- 53 incomplete applications were received last week and are still being processed
- Total grant funds administered = \$286,700
- Per grant average = \$9,557

#### OTHER CITY INITIATIVES & IMPACTS

- Pro-rated business & liquor licensing, which provided refunds for the timeframes businesses were closed
- Waivers for temporary outdoor dining & curbside operations
- Mask distribution
- Partnership w/Every Meal (Sheridan Story)
- Restaurant closures Green Mill, New Bohemia, Outback, Joe Senser's, Ol' Mexico



#### **Small Business Relief Fund**

#### **PURPOSE**

- Emergency grants of up to \$10,000 to small local businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic
- Help businesses pay for critical expenses such as rent or mortgage payments, utilities, payments to suppliers and costs associated with reopening.
- Increase the capacity of small businesses with a physical location in Roseville to survive the current crisis.

#### ELIGIBILITY

- Ordered to close by Governor's orders
- Can demonstrate revenue loss due to COVID-19
- Need assistance to fund operating costs, includir retention of employees
- Need assistance to purchase and/or be reimburse for COVID-19 safety materials/supplies, equipmen and preparedness plans
- Business in Roseville (or no physical location, but owner/operator resides in Roseville)

#### USE OF FUNDS

- Up to a \$10,000 grant based on economic injury from COVID-19 and eligible expenses.
- Operating expenses, including rent/mortgage payments, utilities
- Payments to supplier
- Dead action of haviness continuous alon
- Technical assistance/reopening services
- Technology capital or marketing assistance/tools
- Other critical non-payroll business expenses

- Current on rent fees or mortgage payments prior to April 1, 2020

# COVID-19 Update

# CARES Act Funds

- Received \$2.7 million
- \$1.6 million already claimed
- May have up to \$3.6 million eligible to be claimed
- Final reports due in November

### Revenue Loss

- License Center down \$486,813 though October. Bulk of loss during 9-week shut down (\$339K)
- Parks and Recreation
  - Golf Course Fund net down by \$34,375
  - Recreation Fund down by \$566,852
- General Fund revenues trending lower
  - Licenses and Permits Down \$122,000
  - Fines and Forfeitures Down by \$60,000
