Item Description: Consider Not Waiving Statutory Liability Limits for 2021

BACKGROUND

- Minnesota Statute 466.04 states that liability of any municipality on any one claimant shall not exceed
- \$500,000 when the claim is for death, wrongful act, or omission; and shall not pay more than \$1,500,000
- 4 for claims arising out of a single occurrence.

5

- State Statute provides municipalities the opportunity to waive the individual statutory limit to better
- accommodate claimants that may have been harmed by the City's actions or negligence. However, by
- waiving the statutory limit there is no limit on the settlement a claimant(s) may receive, and the waiver
- 9 would apply to <u>all</u> claims. The City's Liability Insurance provider requires a formal action by the City
- 10 Council designating its intentions.
