10 **1) INTRODUCTIONS**

11 Chair Dahlstrom introduced the meeting and noted that this month’s meeting was an in-person

20 Chair Dahlstrom called for public comment by members of the audience.

22 **C. Magadance, 2467 Aglen St.**

23 Inquired into the city’s process to clean up Central Park. She noted that as the snow has melted there
24 is a lot of garbage now in the park and in Bennett Lake. She relayed that Central Park is a really
25 great resource and is one of the reasons she purchased her home. Additionally, she would be
26 interested in participating in any potential volunteer effort to help clean up the park.

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41 **4) INTRODUCTION AND OATH OF OFFICE FOR NEW COMMISSION MEMBER**

42 The Oath of Office was completed by Commission Chair Dahlstrom for new Commission member
43 Lindsay Matts-Benson. The Commission welcomed her to the group.

45 **5) REVIEW AND DISCUSS PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION GOALS**

46 The Commission reviewed the goals that were previously discussed at the March 2022 Parks and
47 Recreation Commission meeting.
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49 Vice-Chair Hoag noted that he would potentially like to add more to Goal #3. Specifically,
50 highlighting climate change, the Natural Resource Stewardship Program and the Accelerated EAB
51 program. In addition, he would like to add the support and participation of Commissioners at these
52 programs. He noted that he would like to be assigned to these goals.
53

54 Commissioner Arneson suggested changing the word “sports” to “recreation” for the Short Term
55 Goal #1.c. He added that he would like to be assigned to this goal or to Goal 4.a.
56

57 Commissioner Lenhart relayed that she really liked all of the Commission goals. However, she
58 would specifically like to be added to Goal #1.b. She noted that she believes Goal #1.b is related to
59 Goals #4.a and #4.b.
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61 Commissioner Boulton added that he would like to work on Goal #1.c with Commissioner Arneson.
62

63 Chair Dahlstrom noted that he would like to be involved with Goals #4.a and #4.b.
64

65 Chair Dahlstrom inquired if any additional short or long term goals should be added.
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67 Commissioner Lenhart suggested adding the “Short Term Goal: Complete engagement process and
68 solicit naming ideas” and “Long Term Goal: Complete renaming process” to Goal #2.a “Pocahontas
69 Park Naming Project”. She added that she would like to be assigned to that goal as well.
70

71 Chair Dahlstrom suggested potentially adding Commissioner Baggenstoss to Goal #2.a as he is not
72 at the meeting tonight but is passionate about the Pocahontas Park Renaming Project. Commissioner
73 Lenhart added that he may also want to be added to Goal #1.b.
74

75 Commissioner Arneson offered that he would also like to be added to Goal #4.a. He noted that Goal
76 #4.a appears to relate to Goal #1.a and #1.b.
77

78 Vice-Chair Hoag suggested that a Commission member does not need to be assigned to every goal
79 as the Commission owns all of the goals. However, if anyone is passionate about any of the goals
80 then they should be assigned to it.

81 Commissioner Brown asked to be added to Goals #3 and #4.a.

83 Commissioner Matts-Benson requested to be added to Goal #1.a as she previously has worked on
 84 equity and accessibility. She also noted that many of the goals intertwine together with other goals.

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88 **6) STAFF REPORT**

89 **a) NEW OR RELEVANT COMMUNICATIONS AND UPDATE ITEMS**

- 90 ○ A potential Request for Assistance (RFA) was provided to the Commission for the
- 91 Pocahontas Park Naming Project. Another version of the RFA will be provided to the
- 92 Commission at subsequent meetings.
- 93 ○ The 2021/2022 deer reduction season has been completed. 43 deer were removed
- 94 from the city (28 were removed from the Owasso are and the remaining 15 were
- 95 taken from south Roseville in the Reservoir Woods area). Once the final report is

96 received from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) it will be brought
97 to the Commission. In addition, Ramsey County did not complete a deer population
98 count flyover this winter.

- 99 ○ The Roseville Skating Center bonding projects are underway. The pads at the Guidant
100 John Rose MN OVAL will also be replaced as part of the bonding project. Proposals
101 for new pads have been received using the Best Value procurement process and are
102 being reviewed by staff.
- 103 ○ The annual Roseville Skate School Ice Shows will be April 28-30.
- 104 ○ The contractor for the Evergreen pickleball courts and Anpétu Téča tennis courts is
105 ready to move forward. An average temperature of 50 degrees is needed to start the
106 project. The entire project will take approximately one month, starting with the
107 completion of the tennis courts before converting Evergreen Park to pickleball courts.
- 108 ○ The first community meeting for the Accelerated Emerald Ash Borer Program was
109 last week. The vendor, Tree Trust, will begin removing trees this spring in the
110 southeast quadrant of the city, and will continue with removals working
111 counterclockwise. Initial focus will be on the trees in the worst condition. Residents
112 will be notified of any trees that will be removed, trees will be marked with a pink
113 ring and homeowners will be provided an informational door-hanger.
- 114 ○ Volunteer tree planting on Saturday, June 4.
- 115 ○ Cedarholm Golf Course is planning to open on April 6.
- 116 ○ Granite City will have an upcoming soft-opening at the Cedarholm Golf Course
117 Community Building.
- 118 ○ Summer staff are still needed at Roseville Parks and Recreation. The typical age is
119 16+ for jobs. However, is someone who is younger is interested they are encouraged
120 to apply.
- 121 ○ There are many programs and special events coming up.
- 122 ○ The virtual option for Commission meetings is through April, 2022. Unless the
123 Mayor's declaration is extended the May Commission meeting will be in-person.
- 124 ○ Kite Day on April 20 (10:00a.m – 12:00pm) at Rosebrook Park. Advanced
125 registration is needed to ensure there is a kite for all participants.
- 126 ○ Upcoming Adult Trips include: Footloose at Chanhassen Dinner Theatre on April 6,
127 State Capital Tour on May 17, Osceola Train Trip on June 23.

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129 **7) OTHER**

130 Commissioner Lenhart asked for further information regarding the pad replacement at the Guidant
131 John Rose MN OVAL. Staff explained that they are the specialized technical pads used for speed
132 skating.
133

134 Commissioner Lenhart asked if there would be any closures at the OVAL during the bonding
135 projects. Staff relayed that certain areas will be closed off at certain times due to construction.
136 However, the OVAL skate park and inline skating track will remain open during the project.
