1. **Introductions/Public Comment Invited**

Commissioners and staff will be introduced. Public participation and public comment is encouraged.

2. **Approval of Minutes of the October 2, 2012 Meeting**

Enclosed is a copy of the minutes of October 2, 2012. Please be prepared to approve or amend.

Requested Action: Approve/amend minutes of the meeting of October 2, 2012.

3. **Community Engagement Task Force Report**

Greg Simbeck and Randall Doneen serve on the Human Rights Commission Community Engagement Task Force as representatives of the Parks and Recreation Commission. Simbeck and Doneen will be prepared to report on the latest progress on this effort. Included in your packet is a copy of the general "areas for recommendation" from the final draft report that was presented to the City Council on Monday, October 22, 2012.

Requested Action: Commission discussion and feedback

4. **Highcrest Park 3rd Addition Park Dedication**

Included in your packet is another Park Dedication item involving the Meritex property. This is the one that was mentioned at your September meeting that would be coming to you for a discussion and recommendation.

Included in your packet is a site, plat and proposed development map. The proposal is for an industrial warehouse/distribution facility. The site is approximately 12.97 acres.

You requested that when Park Dedication items come to you in the future, you would like to see how a land dedication might fit into the plan. In this case, the property owner representative has requested that the proposed developer work directly with Parks and Recreation. As they have formulated their proposal, the entire acreage is needed to make their development work. Therefore, they have opted not to provide a land option and are respectfully requesting that the Commission consider the cash option only. In this case the cash option with an estimated Fair Market Value at $\$2,447,800 \times 05\% = \$122,390$. For your information there is 12.97 acres in the area $\times .05 = .64$ acre.

Requested Action: Commission discussion and possible recommendation

5. **Park Dedication Rates Discussion**

The Commissions role is to review and recommend park dedication rates.

The most recent increase for residential rates was last November, 2011 when the rates were increased from \$3,000 to \$3,500 per unit. Based upon the survey of other communities, system needs, CIP, Master Plan outline of needs and the fact that an increase occurred last year to keep pace, it may be appropriate for the rates to remain and be reviewed again next year.

The Commercial Park Dedication has remained at 5% of FMV for several years. Translating

the % into dollars using the above Meritex development as an example converts into approximately \$9,436 per acre ($\$122,390 / 12.97 \text{ acres} = \$9,436$). Although in the survey there are outliers and on a per acre basis Roseville is slightly above the average; based upon the survey results, system needs, CIP, the outlined Master Plan and the Renewal Program, it may be appropriate to at minimum discuss and consider an increase in the Commercial Park Dedication rate.

This item is included on your agenda to discuss the current rate and to consider a recommendation.

Enclosed is a survey of rates in surrounding metropolitan communities.

Requested Action: Discuss the Park Dedication fee and consider a recommendation

6. **Park and Recreation Renewal Program**

The Best Value process to select the lead consultant is complete. On October 15, 2012, the City Council authorized the Mayor and City Manager to enter into an agreement with LHB Consulting with the scope of work as previously outlined in the Request for Proposals and at previous Commission meetings.

On Monday, October 22, 2012, the City Council awarded the final sale of bonds to complete the funding package for the entire \$19M Park and Recreation Renewal Program. The low bid rate for the bonds was 2.0781%.

Staff is now working in earnest with Michael Schroeder of LHB to finalize the agreement and to outline a schedule of actions such as coordination, project packages and conducting community design work.

Any new progress will be reported at the meeting.

1. INTRODUCTIONS/ROLL CALL/PUBLIC COMMENT

None

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 15, 2012 MEETING

Commission Recommendation:

Minutes for the September 15, 2012 meeting were approved unanimously. Wall abstained from vote because he was not at the meeting.

3. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT TASK FORCE REPORT

Doneen & Simbeck reported that the final draft report has been presented to the Human Rights Commission for their approval and the Task Force is looking to bring their final recommendations to the Council later this month.

4. BEGIN DISCUSSION OF A PARK BOARD

Etten introduced the agenda item and stated how these are preliminary discussions following the Council request for information and input on the possibility of a Park Board in Roseville.

- Doneen clarified content of the city Attorney's memo in regards to the definition and processes between a Park Board and a Park District.
- Brokke provided a brief explanation of the three possible structures including a Parks & Recreation Commission, Parks & Recreation Board and a Parks & Recreation District and that a District would require legislative approval. The focus was on exploring the Park Board concept.
- Etten explained that a Parks & Recreation Board would operate similar to the HRA Board.
- Ristow questioned the need for looking into a Park Board ... if things are running fine at this time why make a change. Ristow suggested tabling the discussion.
 - Dave Holt reminded the commission that the Council asked for information and for the commission to research pros and cons for a Park Board.
 - Commissioners brainstormed preliminary pros and cons including;
 - (+) a very transparent and identifiable system. Tax statements would specifically identify tax amounts for park services
 - (+) a Park Board could potentially involve citizens with strong interests and knowledge in park system operations
 - (+) potential to streamline/speed up some processes
 - (-) potential for duplication of services
 - Wall inquired into how it might affect budgeting processes
 - Brokke explained that a Park Board would be more involved and provide leadership, direction and approve a department budget
 - Simbeck recognized the need for diversity on a board to best represent a community.
- Commissioners asked staff to compile a listing of pros and cons of a Park Board based on professional practices and knowledge. Commissioners will also contribute their idea of possible advantages and concerns for a Park Board.

52 **5. PARK & RECREATION RENEWAL PROGRAM**

53 Etten & D. Holt introduced the most recent Renewal Program events to the commission. Holt
54 reported on the Best Value process used for identifying the potential best value for the lead consultant
55 position. Holt talked about how the Best Value process minimizes decision making; as you drill down
56 through the process the decision is made for you. Holt feels that the process leads to identifying
57 contractors who can do the job most effectively and efficiently.
58

59 Brokke informed the Commission that LHB Consulting received the highest point value through the
60 evaluation process and was within budget. LHB also identified additional services to the community
61 and City staff as an added value to maximize project success. Brokke continued to summarize the
62 LHB deliverables and project recommendations. Michael Schroeder will act as project manager for
63 LHB.
64

65 In addition to information on the Best Value process used to select the lead consultant, Brokke
66 explained how Arizona State University is training and working with City staff on the Best Value
67 process. As we move forward ASU and staff will take the program to the community to keep those
68 interested informed on the process.
69

70 Citizen involvement will continue with the Renewal Program.

- 71 • Doneen has agreed to lead a committee that brings together representatives from the Parks &
72 Recreation Commission, PWET Commission and the Roseville and Mounds View School
73 Districts. This group's primary role will involve pathway projects with a secondary role
74 related to Natural Resource Management.
- 75 • Doneen and staff is also working with community members from the original implementation
76 teams Natural Resources & Trails Workgroup to provide volunteer service as appropriate
77 projects arise during the Renewal Program.

- Etten recognized how commissioners around the table are stepping up for extra duties and are actively participating in many ways.
- Ristow recognized the greater good that will come from the Parks and Recreation Renewal Program, in addition to upgraded parks and recreation resources, the program will put people to work in the community, including Veterans. Mr. Ristow also spoke passionately of his frustration brought on by the lawsuit that set back work on the Renewal Program by more than 6 months and cost the City more than \$300,000.

Commission Recommendation:

Motion by Ristow asking the Commission to recommend that the Roseville City Council look into the group responsible for recent legal litigations related to the bonding program and hold those involved responsible for court costs and additional interest fees. D. Holt seconded the motion for sake of discussion.

- Commission discussion followed;
 - Commissioners recognized that the Council has made the choice not to pursue any further legal process on this matter.
 - Many agree that there should be some consequences for these legal delays and the actions were based on myopic personal views.
 - Commissioners understood Ristow's (and other's) frustration because people responsible for the legal actions are not being held accountable;
 - Commissioners reminded themselves and others that citizens have the philosophical right to bring forward a case if they feel the governmental process is not being followed. It is the hope that a due process is handled in a timely and prudent manner.
 - Commissioners also spoke passionately about the need for the City to heal, move forward and focus on future positives.

Following the discussion, Ristow withdrew his motion.

9. Improve notification process.

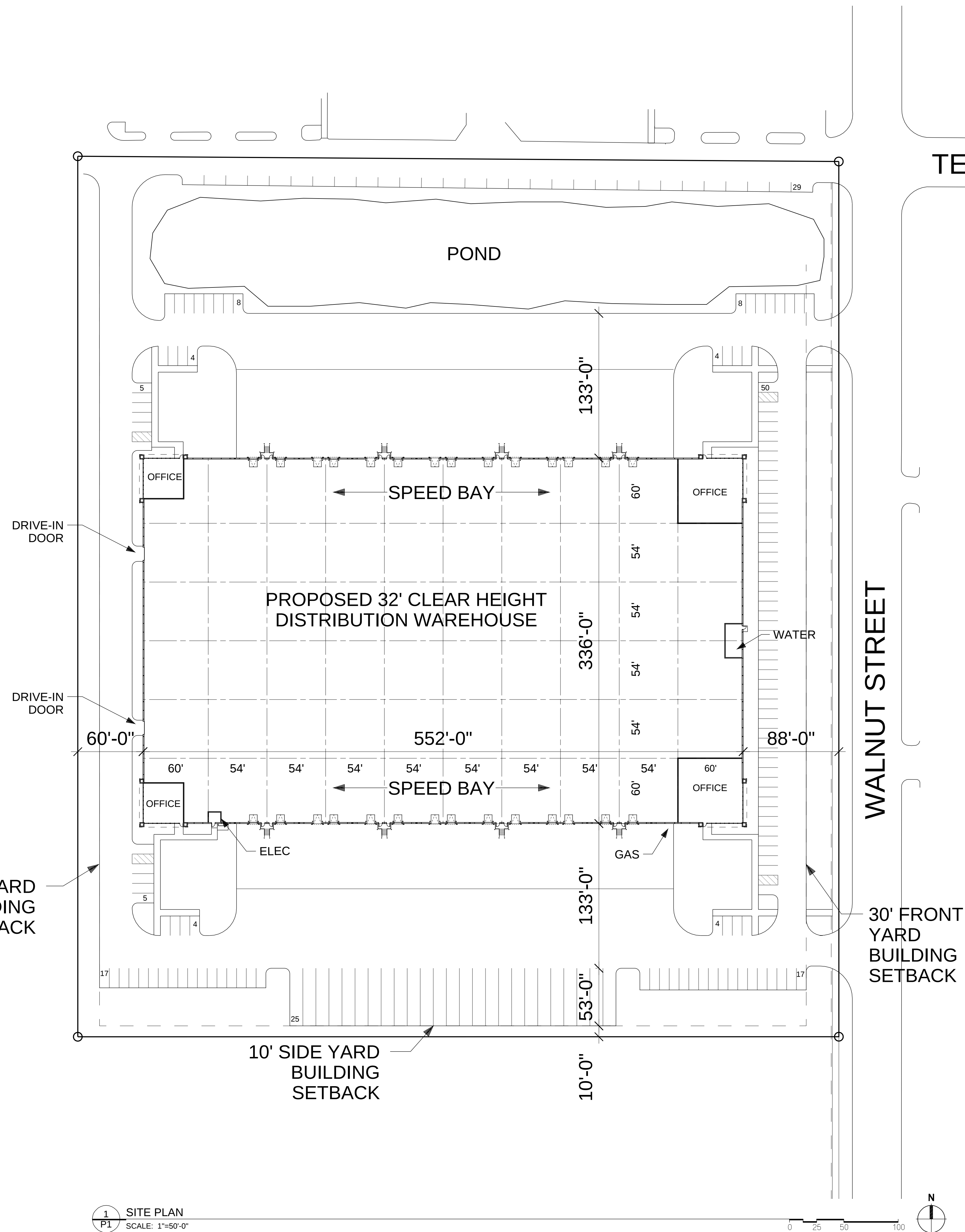
