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Item Description: Finalize Community Survey Discussion and Survey Budget

### BACKGROUND

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On March 14, 2016, City Council directed staff to revise portions of the proposed 2016 resident survey. Based on input from the City Council the survey now comprises 117 questions. The newly-revised survey is included in Attachment A. The City Council also directed staff to obtain pricing options and associated margins of error for increasing the number of residents included in. Pricing and margins of error for survey sizes are:

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### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS**

The 2016 budget includes \$20,000 for a survey of Roseville residents. The cost to conduct a 117question survey of 400 randomly selected residents with a +/- 5.0% margin of error by The Morris Leatherman company is \$18,500. Morris Leatherman did provide additional pricing options for delivering surveys with +/- 4.5% and +/- 4.0% margins of errors as noted above. However, the company believes that while those reductions in margin of error may be significant in some political campaigns, a margin of error of +/- 5.0% for a community survey of residents was both appropriate and the best value.

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### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends City Council approve the residential survey draft and final budget for a 400-resident community survey. Staff also recommends City Council approve staff arranging a contract for resident survey services with The Morris Leatherman Company.

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## REQUESTED COUNCIL ACTION

A motion to approve the 2016 residential survey draft, approve budget for a 400-resident community survey and approve arranging a contract for resident survey services with The Morris Leatherman Company.
