Item Description: Communication Items

Public Works Project updates:

- Water Booster Station Phase 2
 - The contract for this project was awarded on July 23, 2018.
 - Work will continue through September of 2019.
 - Work includes: HVAC upgrades, electrical upgrades including creation of an electrical room, security upgrades, replacement of two pumps and replacement of some underground piping and valves.
 - Work on this phase is approximately 90% completed.
- 2019 Sewer CIPP
 - The 2019 project involved 4.8 miles of sanitary sewer pipe and one small segment of storm sewer. All work on this project is completed.
- Fernwood Lift Station
 - The project includes the upgrade of the lift station. The project was awarded to Minger Construction, Inc on July 8. Work on the lift station will likely begin mid to late summer of 2019.
- 2019 Pavement Management Project
 - This year's pavement management project consists of approximately 8.5 miles of mill and overlay. Work is currently focused on two neighborhoods off of Lexington Avenue north of County Road B2.
 - The project is about 60% completed. See Attachment B for areas completed.
- City Hall Parking Lot
 - The project consists of reconstructing the parking lot between City Hall and the Maintenance Facility. Work involves the realignment of the access to Civic Center Drive, related storm sewer work, achieving ADA compliance, and replacement of water and sewer mains under the parking lot.
 - The water and sanitary sewer have been replaced. The storm sewer work is ongoing with curb work and grading following shortly thereafter.
 - The project should be completed by October 4th. See attachment C for phasing and parking during the construction.
 - At least 20 parking spots, including handicapped parking, will be available to visitors to City Hall.
- Ramsey County Library Entrance Modification
 - Bids were opened on August 20. The bids came in higher than anticipated but Ramsey County, who is paying for the improvements, wants to proceed with the project. The project is scheduled to be awarded at the August 26 Council meeting. Work will be done this fall.

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services updates:

- Avon street
 - This project is essentially complete.
- Upper Villa
 - This project is essentially complete. The overlay of the trail should occur the week of August 26 and turf will be restored shortly thereafter. All erosion control measures will be removed once turf is established.

Ramsey County:

- County Road C Reconstruction: Hwy 88 to Long Lake Road
 - The County will be reconstructing County Road C between Highway 88 in St. Anthony and Long Lake Road in Roseville in 2019.
 - Work is underway with traffic down to one lane in each direction.
 - Traffic is anticipated to shift to the west bound lanes late the week of August 26.
- County Road C Concrete Rehabilitation: Cleveland Ave to Snelling Ave
 - Work includes concrete maintenance on County C between Cleveland Avenue and Snelling Avenue. Work includes ADA upgrades and concrete joint repairs.
 - Work is on hold during the State Fair but will resume after Labor Day. When work resumes traffic will be down to one lane in each direction. Approximately two to three weeks of work remain.
- Lexington Avenue Resurfacing, County Road C2 to County Road E
 - All work on the project is completed.

Minnesota Department of Transportation updates:

- I-35W MnPASS project - <http://www.dot.state.mn.us/metro/projects/i35wroseville/>
 - Construct MnPASS Express Lanes (one lane in each direction) in the middle of existing I-35W between County Road C in Roseville and Lexington Avenue (County Rd 17) in Blaine.
 - Repave I-35W and ramps between County Road C in Roseville to just north of Sunset Ave (County Road 53) in Lino Lakes.
 - Replace and repair bridges along the project area.
 - Install noise walls on the east side of I-35W just north of the County Road C ramps to County Road D.
 - Contract was awarded in October to Ames Construction which had the winning Design/Build Proposal. Total cost is \$208 million.
 - Major road work is underway.
 - The southbound TH 51 (Snelling Avenue) turn lane to southbound Hamline will be closed for the remainder of the project.
 - All traffic is shifted to the northbound lanes with two through lanes in each direction.
 - The on ramps from County Road C to southbound 35W will be closed until November.
 - Rosegate Avenue will be closed through November.

Miscellaneous Updates:

- Organics Drop off Site
 - The new pad for the organics drop off site has been installed at the leaf recycling center off of Dale Street. The area around the pad has also been paved. Once a container is delivered and signs are installed, the site will be opened.
- State Fair Parking
 - Earlier this year the city contacted residents living closest to the park-and-ride lots. Based on feedback, the city has approved restricting parking within a quarter mile of the lots to one side of the street, and in some instances to both sides of the

street. Attachment E shows the additional parking restrictions that will be implemented. Staff installed the signs prior to the fair a will monitor the restrictions this year and consider adjustments in future years.

- Youth Members: Staff has started to solicit for Youth Members for this commission as well as the Parks and Recreation Commission and the Human Rights, Inclusion and Engagement Commission. To date we have not received any interest. However, these positions are typically filled through work with the area High Schools and/or direct recruitment by Commission members. We hope to have some candidates by the time we meet again in September. Attached is a flyer that can be used by the Commission Members to help us recruit for these openings.

City Council Update:

- August
 - Council received presentation on PWETC recommendation to establish a third tiered rate. Council discussed the proposal. They took no action but recommended staff focus on education and outreach. Staff will work to send information out to high water users on how to reduce water use. We will also look at using a possible Met Council grant to offer rebates for water efficient appliances and smart irrigation controllers.
 - Approved Ramsey County Master Signal Agreement
 - Approved Ramsey County Library Entrance Modification Cooperative Agreement.
 - Approved Parkview Elementary Stormwater Project Cooperative Agreement.
 - City Manager presented City Manager Budget.

Major Maintenance Activities:

- Street and Storm
 - Installed signs for State Fair Parking
 - Completed second sweep
 - Ongoing Streetscape maintenance. Weeding, pruning.
 - Started 5th mow.
 - Re-painting of message pavement markings completed.
 - Began crack sealing roads.
 - Ongoing repair of failed catch basins.
 - Ongoing mill and patching of delamination streets.
 - Ongoing spray injection patching of delamination streets.
 - Ongoing compost turning continuing Friday. Deliveries of compost.
 - Ongoing sign repair and installs.
 - Some tree trimming. Minor wind related limbs down.
 - Ongoing debris clearing of pond inlets and outlets related to continual rainfall.
- Water and Sanitary Sewer
 - Continued collecting sanitary sewer flow data every other Friday
 - Completed flushing and inspecting private hydrants
 - Ongoing hydrant painting.
 - Continued the 2019 Sanitary Sewer Cleaning program
 - Collected water samples for bacteriological and disinfectant by-product testing
 - Continued replacing meter heads and radios
 - Continued working with engineers and contractors on the Booster Station Phase 2 project
 - Continued working with city engineers and consulting engineers on the Fernwood lift station project
 - Continued working with engineers and contractor on County Road C project

- Continued the 2019 valve exercising program
- Continued 2019 Lead / Copper sampling program
