Greetings Mayor, Councilmembers and City Staff,

I am writing to request that the City of Roseville would reject the use of tear gas and munitions as a response to protesters. There is evidence that tear gas has irreversible health effects especially on women and children. It is my hope that this item will, at the very least, make it onto an agenda in the near future and that our City will engage in a meaningful, informed conversation about how protesters must be treated and given the time and space to express grievances regarding public officials and law

enforcement, without being subjected to dangerous tactics to silence them. This is an important conversation to be had before tensions are high, to identify the values of our City in advance, and to use that as a lens for humane decision-making if and when such protests may occur in Roseville. Hi Mayor Roe, City Council & Staff,

I understand that Council Member Strahan has requested consideration of a resolution having the City of Roseville declare racism as a public health crisis, and also consideration of a proclamation declaring the first Monday of June as National Gun Violence Awareness Day. I am writing in support of both of these topics, in the interest of racial equity initiatives the city may be undertaking.

First, as other local, national and global entities have identified system racism and structural racism having negative impacts on public health, it would show our BIPOC residents as well as non-BIPOC residents that the city and the community recognize this. Further, I would ask the Council and Staff to research what resources, initiatives, and collaborations with other agency (county, state, federal) might become available or recommended as a result of such a declaration.

Second, on the issue of gun violence, while this may not rise to the epidemic levels of public health crisis within the borders of Roseville, as it does in other local cities, it still is a significant issue that impacts our community. As you are likely aware, within the last year, at least one family of Roseville Area Schools experienced murder of family members. Around 15 years ago, my daughter was victim of an attempted armed robbery at Rosedale. A few days ago, I stood at the intersection of Rice & Larpenteur, with many of my Roseville neighbors, demonstrating in support of the Nia Black's mother, who lost her daughter to gun violence across Larpenteur at the Lamplighter strip club a few years back. While there may be a variety of structural rules and regulations that dictate whether or not a declaration is allowable, please put some focus on the issue and impacts of gun violence on safety and equity in our community.
