But I am definitely the type of person who signs up for all the email newsletters and follows the city on social media. The question is how do you reach everyone else? It seems like the city of Roseville is really stepping up its efforts to answer this question by creating the Community Engagement Commission.

It sounds like the commission will work with the city to come up with new and creative ways to both communicate and engage with residents. I am particularly excited about the city's efforts to engage under-represented groups. I have a passion for this both in my volunteer work with The Alley Newspaper in the Phillips Community in Minneapolis and my work at the Minnesota State College Student Association where we work with many first-generation college students who come from under-represented groups.

Any further information you would like the City Council to consider or that you feel is relevant to the appointment or reappointment you are seeking.: I also am very interested in the Public Works, Environment & Transportation Commission, which is why I am applying for that commission, as well. My resume doesn't show it because I don't have any work experience in the area, but I am very interested in transit, public works and environmental issues. I have attended community meetings about proposed transit routes and changes to existing ones, contacted my lawmakers in support of transit projects and funding and been an avid rider of transit for many years.

On a personal scale, I am working to make our new home in Roseville as green as possible and have done a lot of research in this area. We have implemented some small-scale changes in our home, such as having a home energy audit, replacing our "dumb" thermostat with a "smart" thermostat, installing a retrofitted dual-flush system on our toilet and using cloth diapers for our newborn. But that's just the start—I have some big plans for the future that I am really excited about!





#### BACKGROUND

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Under City Code, a public hearing is required to consider approving liquor licenses for the current calendar year. The City has received an application for a 2014 Liquor License as follows:

❖ Digby's Roseville, LLC – Outside Sales and Consumption Endorsement

This item is a Request to Perform a City Abatement for Unresolved Public Nuisance Violations at 3021 Fairview Avenue.

#### BACKGROUND

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- The subject property is a single-family detached home.
- 3 The current owner is Pastor Randol Davis.
- 4 Current violations include:
  - Soils excavated from a recent building addition project at 3021 Fairview have been placed along the south property line in such a manner that erosion onto an adjacent property has occurred and there is the potential for additional erosion with the coming spring melt. Failure to contain the excavated soils qualifies as a nuisance under Section 407.01 Definitions and is a violation of Section 407.02.D Accumulation of Debris (ground).
    - o In October of 2013, following receipt of a complaint that erosion was occurring onto an adjoining property, City Code Enforcement staff and Engineering Department staff inspected the construction site. Required erosion control measures that had been initially installed by the property owner were now failing, and, soils were eroding onto adjoining property.
    - On October 18, 2013 the property owner was instructed to: remove soils from up against the erosion control fabric (causing it to fail), remove soils that were piled up against a fence (functioning as erosion control), re-establish all areas of erosion control to functionality, and, stabilize all exposed soils.
    - A subsequent inspection revealed that the property owner had: stabilized significant areas
      of exposed soil with sod, removed significant amounts of soil up against the erosion
      control fabric and fence, and, re-established many areas of erosion control fabric.
      However, these efforts were not complete repairs and the potential for soil erosion, onto
      the adjoining property, remained.
    - On November 26, 2013 staff notified the property owner to complete the erosion control repairs by removing the last of the soils piled against the fabric and the fence, and, to stabilize all remaining areas of exposed soils. However, to date no additional repairs to the erosion control measures have been observed (likely due to winter weather freezing all soils and making repairs difficult).
    - o Therefore, the potential for additional soil erosion, onto adjoining property, remains high.

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Based upon past response, there is every reason to believe the property owner will make further repairs to erosion control. However, it also appears the property owner does not fully understand his responsibilities regarding erosion control, and, his responses in the past have not always been timely. Furthermore, this is very much a time-sensitive issue. If soil erosion does occur onto adjacent property with the spring melt, immediate repair measures will be necessary.

With an abatement action approved, any delay by the property owner in containing erosion could be met with quick action by the City to install additional erosion control measures and limit erosion leaving the site (the City would give the property owner 3 days advance notification). An erosion control abatement action would include hay bales, erosion control fabric and/or tarps.

• Without an abatement action approved, any delay by the property owner in containing erosion could result in greater harm to the adjoining property as City staff would have to initiate the abatement process at that time. This could result in a delay of 2-3 weeks or more.

Council approval of this precautionary abatement action would also be a strong incentive for the property owner to complete erosion control repairs and ensure erosion from his property remains contained. The City has used precautionary abatement actions in the past with success.

A status update, including pictures, will be provided at the public hearing.

#### POLICY OBJECTIVE

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Property maintenance through City abatement activities is a key tool to preserving high-quality 50 residential neighborhoods. Both Imagine Roseville 2025 and the City's 2030 Comprehensive Plan 51 support property maintenance as a means by which to achieve neighborhood stability. The Housing 52 section of Imagine Roseville suggests that the City "implement programs to ensure safe and well-53 maintained properties." In addition, the Land Use chapter (Chapter 3) and the Housing and 54 Neighborhoods chapter (Chapter 6) of the Comprehensive Plan support the City's efforts to maintain 55 livability of the City's residential neighborhoods with specific policies related to property maintenance 56 and code compliance. Policy 6.1 of Chapter 3 states that the City should promote maintenance and 57 reinvestment in housing and Policy 2.6 of Chapter 6 guides the City to use code-compliance activities 58 as one method to prevent neighborhood decline. 59

#### FINANCIAL IMPACTS

A City abatement action would encompass the following:

Install erosion control to limit erosion leaving the site: Approximately \$1,500.00
 Stabilize exposed soils to limit erosion: Approximately \$1,500.00
 Total: Approximately - \$3,000.00

In the short term, costs of any abatement action would be paid out of the HRA budget, which has allocated \$100,000 for abatement activities. The property owner would then be billed for actual and administrative costs. If charges were not paid, staff would recover costs as specified in Section 407.07B. Costs would be reported to Council following any abatement.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Council direct Community Development staff to abate the above referenced nuisance violations at 3021 Fairview Avenue by hiring a contractor to re-establish erosion control and stabilize exposed soils (if the property owner does not contain erosion after a three day notice of erosion occurring).

Item Description:

Discuss and seek Council direction regarding possible changes to recreational vehicle, boat and trailer parking regulations in Chapter 407 (Nuisances) of the City Code.

#### BACKGROUND

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- In response to concerns from citizens, Council identified the need to review Roseville's City Code
- public nuisance regulations regarding the parking and storage of RV's, trailers and boats on public
- streets and private driveways. At the July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013 City Council meeting Council discussed possible
- 5 changes and directed staff to perform additional research and report back to Council with findings.
- 6 Staff conducted research including:
  - Complaints from the public to Code Enforcement involving RV's, trailers and boats.
  - Complaints from the public to Police involving RV's, trailers and boats.
  - Contacting other communities (similar age and size) to see how they regulate these same items.
  - Provide pictures showing examples or situations generating complaints.
  - Note: there are many regulations covering RV's, trailers and boats. Council direction limited discussion and research to recent complaints regarding the parking and storage of RV's and boats on public streets and utility trailers on front yard driveways of private property.
  - The following attachments identify research results:
    - Attachment A: Numbers of complaints received by Code Enforcement and Police.
    - Attachment B: How other communities regulate RV's, trailers and boats.
    - Attachment C: Roseville regulations as presently written.
    - Attachment D: Pictures of situations generating complaints.

#### 19 FINDINGS

<u>Trailers on front yard driveways:</u> (currently limited to 3 days):

Few complaints are received yearly about trailers on front yard driveways. While a nice looking trailer in a driveway will not generate complaints, a dilapidated unsightly trailer on the same driveway will generate very vocal complaints from neighbors.

Most residents do not complain about the current City Code regulations and willingly store them in a side or rear yard area. The biggest difficulty for residents is when they physically cannot move a trailer into a side or rear yard due to: lack of maneuvering space, hilly terrain, or, blockage due to fences and landscaping. The current City Code does not allow exceptions for these instances.

#### RV's and boats on public streets:

Many other cities regulate the placement of large RV's or boat/trailer combinations on public streets; the reasons varied (some relate to safety and some to aesthetics). Methods of regulation also varied.

While few RV's are parked for extended periods on public streets, staff does receive complaints regarding this practice. And, while aesthetics is a concern, the bigger issue (based on comments from complainants) appears to be safety (blocking sight lines).

#### 20 OPTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

Trailers on front yard driveways:

- 1. Retain existing wording which limits utility trailer storage/parking on a front yard driveway to a maximum of 3 days.
- 2. Allow the unlimited storage/parking of utility trailers on front yard driveways.
- 3. Allow the storage/parking of utility trailers on front yard driveways only when access is not possible to a side or rear yard area (using a process similar to the existing Administrative Deviation process to approve exceptions).

RV's and trailer/boat parking on public streets:

- 1. Retain existing regulations:
  - Which do not restrict the parking of RV's, boats and trailers on public streets (except for certain postings and snow plowing).
  - Which allows the parking of RV's anywhere on a driveway indefinitely.
  - Which allows the parking of boats on trailers (of less than 20') on a front yard driveway indefinitely.
- 2. Limit RV, boat and trailer parking on the street between 2 am and 5 am.
- 3. Limit RV, boat and trailer parking on the street to 72 hours.
- 4. Limit just boat and trailer parking on the street to 72 hours.
- 5. Limit RV, boat and trailer parking on private driveways for safety reasons:
  - Require a 15' setback to the curb for RV's, boats and trailers parked on private driveways (safety issue – blocking sight lines).
- 6. Limit RV, boat and trailer parking on public streets for safety reasons:
  - Require a 20' parking setback to a driveway entrance (on a public street) for RV's, boats and trailers (safety issue blocking sight lines).
  - Require trailers on the street to be attached to a motorized vehicle (safety issue so they can't roll).

#### 21 STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Direct staff to revise Section 407 of the City Code to:

• Allow the storage/parking of utility trailers on front yard driveways when access to side and rear yards is restricted (creating a process similar to the Administrative Deviation process).

Direct staff to revise Section 407 of the City Code to include the following safety regulations:

- Require a 20' parking setback to driveway entrances for RV's, boats and trailers.
- Require a 15' setback to the curb for RV's, boats and trailers parked on private driveways.
- Allow trailers on residential streets only when attached to a motorized vehicle.
- Limit boat and trailer parking on public streets to 72 hours.

## Numbers of complaints received by Code Enforcement and Police

- Complaints received by Code Enforcement:
  - o 2013: 7 complaints total:
    - 2 of trailers in front yard area.
    - 3 of campers in front yard area.
    - 1 of commercial trailer in residential area.
    - 1 of large boat in street
  - o 2012: 6 complaints total:
    - 2 of trailers in front yard area.
    - 1 of camper in front yard area.
    - 2 of commercial trailer in residential area.
    - 1 of living in camper.
  - o 2011: 3 complaints total:
    - 1 of camper in front yard.
    - 1 of camper parked on street.
    - 1 of commercial trailer in residential area.
- Police do not keep records of complaints regarding boat/trailer and RV parking on streets because they are not actual city code violations. The complainant is informed this is not a violation, therefore no report is created. Dispatch also knows this, so squads are not sent when these complaint calls are received.

## How other communities regulate RV's, Boats and Trailers

- Regulations and comments from other communities:
  - Shakopee:
    - Street Parking:
      - ✓ RV's can't park on the street.
    - Private Property:
      - ✓ RV's can park (only one) indefinitely on driveway (if 35' or less). Can park in side or rear yard subject to setbacks (15' & 5').
      - ✓ Trailers and boats (if 20' or less) can park indefinitely on a front-yard driveway. Can place in side or rear yards indefinitely (15' & 5' setbacks).
    - Miscellaneous:
      - ✓ A maximum of 2 utility trailers or RV's allowed.
      - ✓ Visitor RV's allowed a maximum of 30 days.
      - ✓ Most complaints are regarding boats too close to the property line.
      - ✓ Police issue citations for violations.

#### o Oakdale:

- Street Parking:
  - ✓ RV's limited to under 8,000lb gvw if parked on street. Can't be on street over 24 hours (complaint driven).
  - ✓ Trailers/boats can only be parked on street if attached to a motorized vehicle.
- Private Property:
  - ✓ Maximum of one recreational type vehicle per property year round (includes RV's, campers, boats, trailers, and snowmobiles).
  - ✓ Can be placed in side or rear on grass.
  - ✓ If in driveway must be 15' minimum from curb.
  - ✓ Trailers/boats can only be parked on street if attached to a motorized vehicle.
- Miscellaneous:
  - ✓ Complaint based. Very few complaints.

#### o Brooklyn Center:

- Street Parking:
  - ✓ Overnight parking of vehicles on the street (any) is not allowed.
- Private Property:
  - ✓ RV's must be on a driveway in the front yard.
  - ✓ Trailers can be on grass in side or rear yard.
- Miscellaneous:
  - ✓ Few complaints received.

### Inver Grove Heights:

- Street Parking:
  - ✓ No limitations for RV's or trailers (unless deemed a safety hazard).
- Private Property:
  - ✓ No limitations for where or how many.
- Miscellaneous:

✓ Council is currently reviewing ordinance revisions due to the many complaints received.

#### o Maplewood:

- Street Parking:
  - ✓ Vehicle parking is restricted from 2am to 6am.
- Private Property:
  - ✓ Indefinitely if on an improved surface.
  - ✓ Boats, campers and trailers allowed inside and rear yards if 5' from property lines.
- Miscellaneous:
  - ✓ Complaint based. Maybe 2 complaints per year.

#### Cottage Grove:

  - ✓ All vehicles limited to 72 hours on the street.
  - ✓ Can't impair sightlines for motorists on ROW.

  - ✓ Must be on an improved surface.

  - ✓ No parking year round from 2am to 6am.

  - ✓ RV's allowed on a front yard driveway if 15' from curb.

  - ✓ Trailers allowed on side and rear yards. Allowed on front yard driveways.
- Miscellaneous:

#### o Edina:

- Street Parking:
  - ✓ Boats and trailers limited to 6 hours on the street.

  - ✓ Trailers and boats allowed on front yard driveway for 7 days maximum provided 15' from curb. Maximum of 2 boats or trailers in side or rear subject to setback requirements.

Roseville's City Code contains the following regulations (in Chapter 407 Nuisances) regarding 23 the parking and storage of trailers and boats on residentially zoned areas (including streets and private property): 25 o Section 407.03: Nuisances Affecting Peace and Safety: 26 Item Q: Storing of Boats, Trailers...in Front Yards: The storing of the following things for a period longer than 72 hours in 28

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nuisance): a. Trailers of any kind, unless supporting a boat of 20 feet or less.

the front vard of any residential zoned area (would qualify as a public

- b. Boats or watercraft of any kind in excess of 20 feet.
- c. Inoperative motor vehicles of any type.
- d. Campers and camper buses.
- ✓ 2. For the purpose of this Section, "front yard" means any area between any public street and a line parallel to the public street at the building line. (Ord. 522, 1-9-1967; 1995 Code)
- o Note: There are no regulations in the city code prohibiting or limiting the parking of RV's, boats or trailers on city streets, provided they are operable, properly licensed and do not create a hazard.
