Monthly summary

1. PATROL INCIDENT SUMMARIES

Assault / Terroristic Threats**Date: 03-03-2017****Time: 2251****Location: XXXX Marion Street****CN: 17005846**

Officers responded to male armed with a large knife who had cut one person and was threatening to kill others and himself. Officers responded and observed a fresh trail of blood leading down the stairs to an apartment, which was wide open and empty. Dispatch then provided the apartment number for the suspect and officers located him in the hallway. After speaking with the victims it was determined, the husband and wife had an argument over money and ultimately the husband grabbed a 14inch knife and began threatening family members who were able to escape the apartment. While escaping, one victim

was cut in the hand and was transported to the hospital for treatment. One adult male from Roseville was arrested for 2nd Degree Assault and Terroristic Threats.

**Narcotics / Recovered Stolen Vehicle****Date: 03-06-2017****Time: 2325****Location: Key Inn; 2550 Cleveland Ave.****CN: 1706234**

Officer Weber was on routine patrol when he observed an occupied vehicle taking up two parking spots behind the hotel. He ran the plate which came back stolen. He called for backup. Officers arrived to assist and together they took the driver and two passengers into custody. Located inside the vehicle were a red facemask and crowbar along with two backpacks. The back packs contained drug paraphernalia, marijuana and methamphetamine. Located in one suspects personal property when being booked was more methamphetamine. Total weight of meth was 2.6 grams and total weight of marijuana was 27 grams. One adult male from Columbia Heights was arrested for 5th Degree Violation of Controlled Substance Law, Tamper with Motor Vehicle, Obstruct Peace Officer and Failure to Obey Lawful Order. One adult male from Columbia Heights was arrested for Receiving Stolen Property.

**Suspicious Activity****Date: 03-07-2017****Time: 0119****Location: 1201 Larpenteur Avenue****CN: 17006239**

Officers responded to a call of a suspicious male who had entered the shed of a vacant business and was yelling "Help Me". Officers arrived and observed smoke coming from the shed and voices of a male and a female inside the shed. The male and female exited the shed and began walking away from officers. Officers identified themselves and the suspects began running. Officers chased them for a short time and caught up with them. Officers located several hypodermic needles and a baggie containing a white crystal substance along with two checks and a credit card in other people's names. The male stated

he was homeless and was using the building as shelter and the fire he built inside to stay warm. One adult male from Montgomery, MN and one adult female from St. Paul were arrested on multiple outstanding warrants, Possession of Hypodermic Syringe, Flee on Foot, Fail to Obey Lawful Order and Trespassing.

Assault

Date: 03-23-2017

Time: 1842

Location: Motel 6; 2300 Cleveland Ave.

CN: 17007690

Officers were dispatched to the Motel on a badly bruised female at the front desk stating she had been assaulted and was being held hostage. Officers arrived and observed the female victim's eyes to be almost completely swollen shut, she had severe swelling on most of her face. She was bleeding from various cuts and had ligature marks on her neck. She told officers her boyfriend and two other females had assaulted her yesterday by kicking, punching and hitting her with an unknown object in Minneapolis. Her boyfriend then tried to put her into the trunk of her car but he was unable to do so. He put her in the front seat and held her down while he drove around. While driving around, one of the females strangled her with a belt to the point where she thought she was going to pass out. She said they eventually covered her head so she couldn't see where she was and they ended up at the Motel. She said they stayed at the Motel for a day and she was unable to call police as the phone had been removed from the wall and she only had a chance to escape today when the suspect and another female left with her car. Officers located one of the female suspects in the hotel room. The victim was transported to Hennepin County Medical Center for Treatment. Officers handed the case over to Minneapolis police as the assault took place in their city.

Assault

Date: 03-25-2017

Time: 1437

Location: McDonald's; 2075 Snelling Avenue

CN: 17007873

Officers were dispatched to a report of two females fighting in the play area. Officers arrived and learned that children had been playing and one mother became upset at how her daughter was being treated so she began using profanities. An employee was notified and she approached the woman and requested she stop swearing. The woman continued to swear when another mother approached and asked her to stop using foul language in front of the children and the suspect began striking the woman in the face. The suspect admitted to swearing and striking the victim in the face because she was upset. One adult female from St. Paul was arrested for 5th Degree Assault and Disorderly Conduct and released at the scene.

Disorderly Conduct

Date: 03-25-2017

Time: 2234

Location: 200 Block of N. McCarrons Blvd.

CN: 17007912

Officers were dispatched to a male knocking and screaming at the security door to the building for over an hour. Officers arrived and located a highly intoxicated male standing at the front door to the building yelling towards the door. Officers approached and asked the man what was going on and the man put his hands on his head and said "don't hit me". Officers told him they were not going to hit him they just wanted to figure out what was going on. The male would go from calm and cooperative to highly agitated very quickly. Officers asked if he had anyone who could take care of him for the evening due to his level of intoxication and he said no. Officers determined it would be best to transport the man to Detox for his own wellbeing. While attempting to place the man in the squad car he became extremely non-compliant, swearing and threatening officers and kicking the squad door. Eventually he spit in the face of one officer. The man was arrested for assault. Detective Baker traveled to the jail to gain consent to obtain a test for communicable diseases. He was advised he had spit in the officer's face. The man turned very pale and began to tear up as he said he was very sorry and agreed to do whatever needed to be done. One adult male from St. Paul was arrested for two counts of Assault 4.

2. INVESTIGATIONS

CN 17006153 – Shots Fired: On 3/6/17 at 0210 hours, Officers were dispatched to the area of 240 Grandview on multiple reports of shots fired. As squads were enroute, a Ramsey County Deputy updated that he observed a vehicle on its roof at the intersection of Woodbridge & Grandview. A male was inside the vehicle and able to crawl out the window. Another male was later found outside the 240 Grandview building. Both subjects were uncooperative with police. Officers then learned of a theft at the Super America on Rice St. Two vehicles left the parking lot at a high rate of speed after the theft, and are believed to be the vehicles involved in shooting at each other. Officers located several shell casings around the area of the shooting. Officers processed the crime scene; collecting evidence and swabbing items for DNA. Detectives arrived to assist. Both suspects were interviewed and released pending further investigation. Later in the morning, RCSO deputies were dispatched to McDonald's in Little Canada, near the incident, on a disturbance involving two males. The males were the same individuals that detectives had interviewed regarding the shooting. During a pat down for weapons, prior to giving them a ride, RCSO deputies located a 9mm Ruger handgun on one of the men. The gun is believed to have been used in the shooting. The firearm and other DNA evidence was submitted to the BCA Lab for analysis. Case pending.



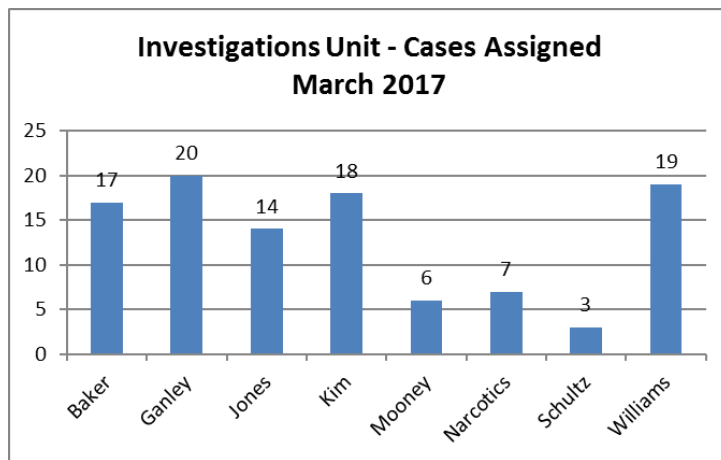
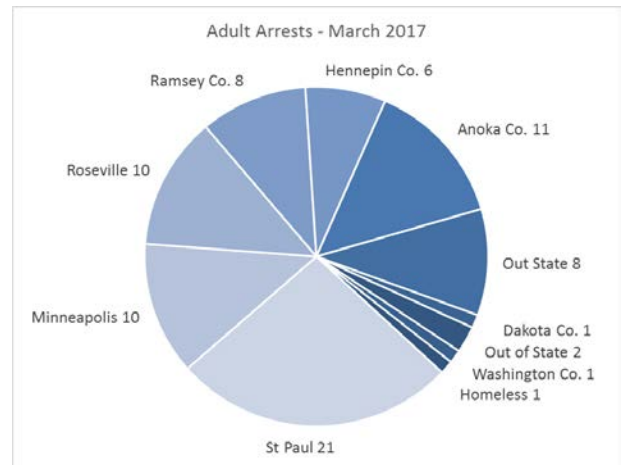
Search Warrants:

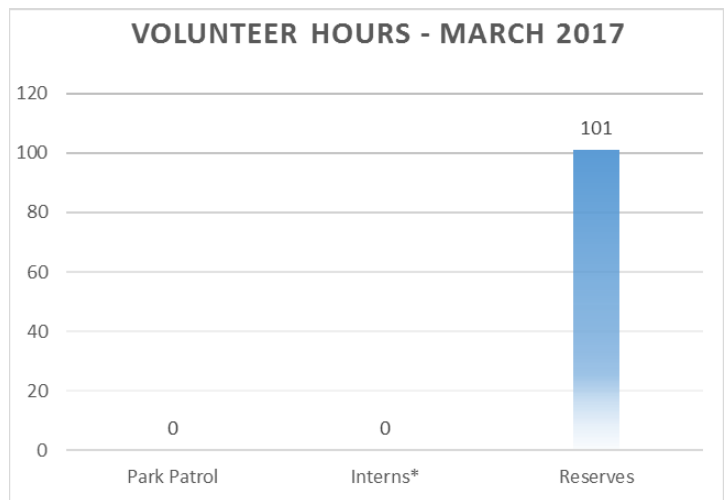

5. VOLUNTEERS

Roseville Police Department utilizes the assistance of volunteers in our everyday course of work. The Reserve Unit are uniformed civilians who drive a marked squad and assist officers by directing traffic when needed, transporting prisoners, etc. The Roseville Police Citizen Park Patrol enlists the help of several residents to patrol our parks daily helping to deter crime and pass out information to park visitors. We also have a steady stream of student interns who are helping us out by running errands for investigations, assisting with paperwork for administration, analyzing statistical data and so much more.

2015 value of volunteer time in MN is \$25.20 per hour. That is a value of \$2,545 this month alone!
