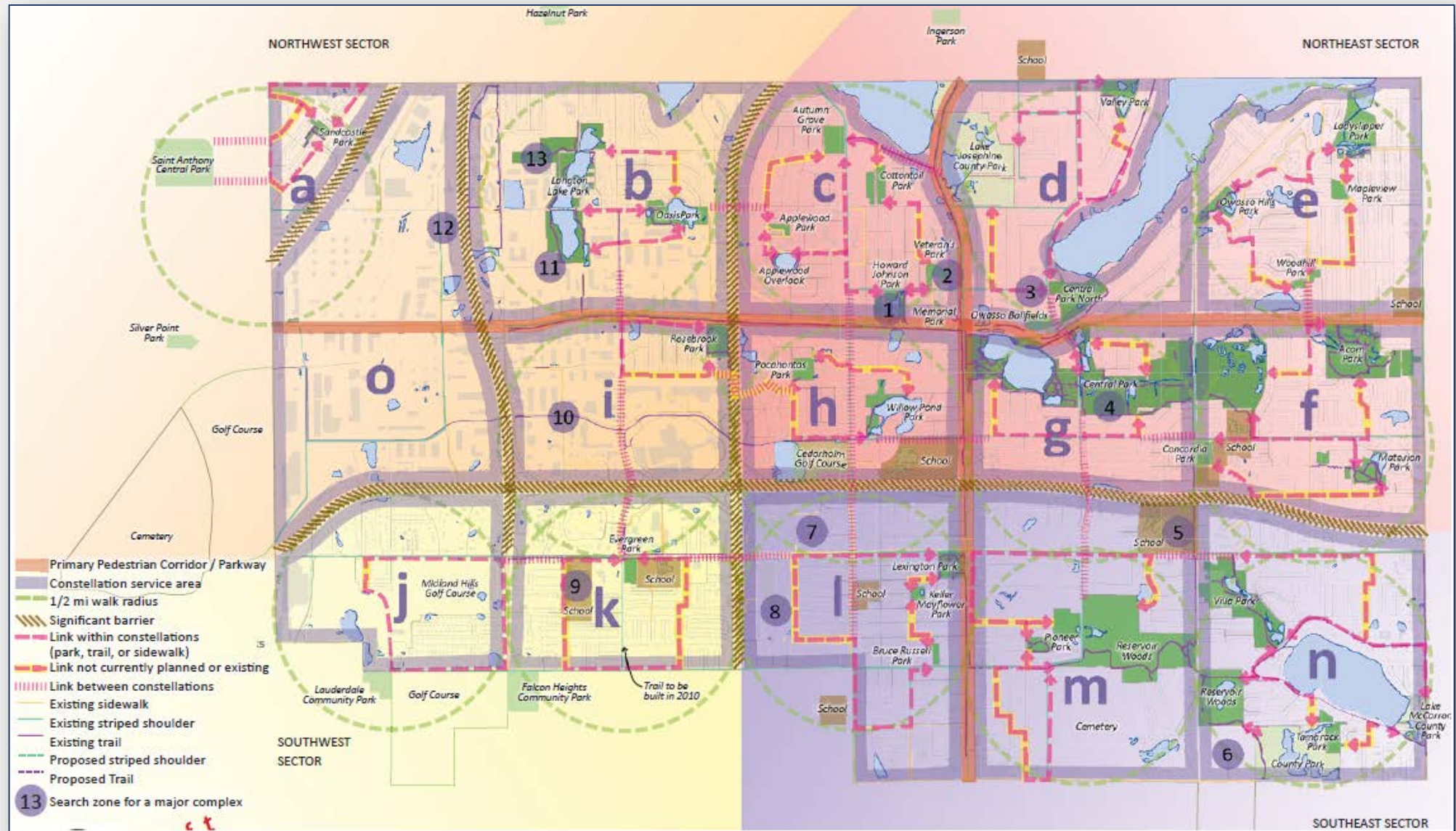

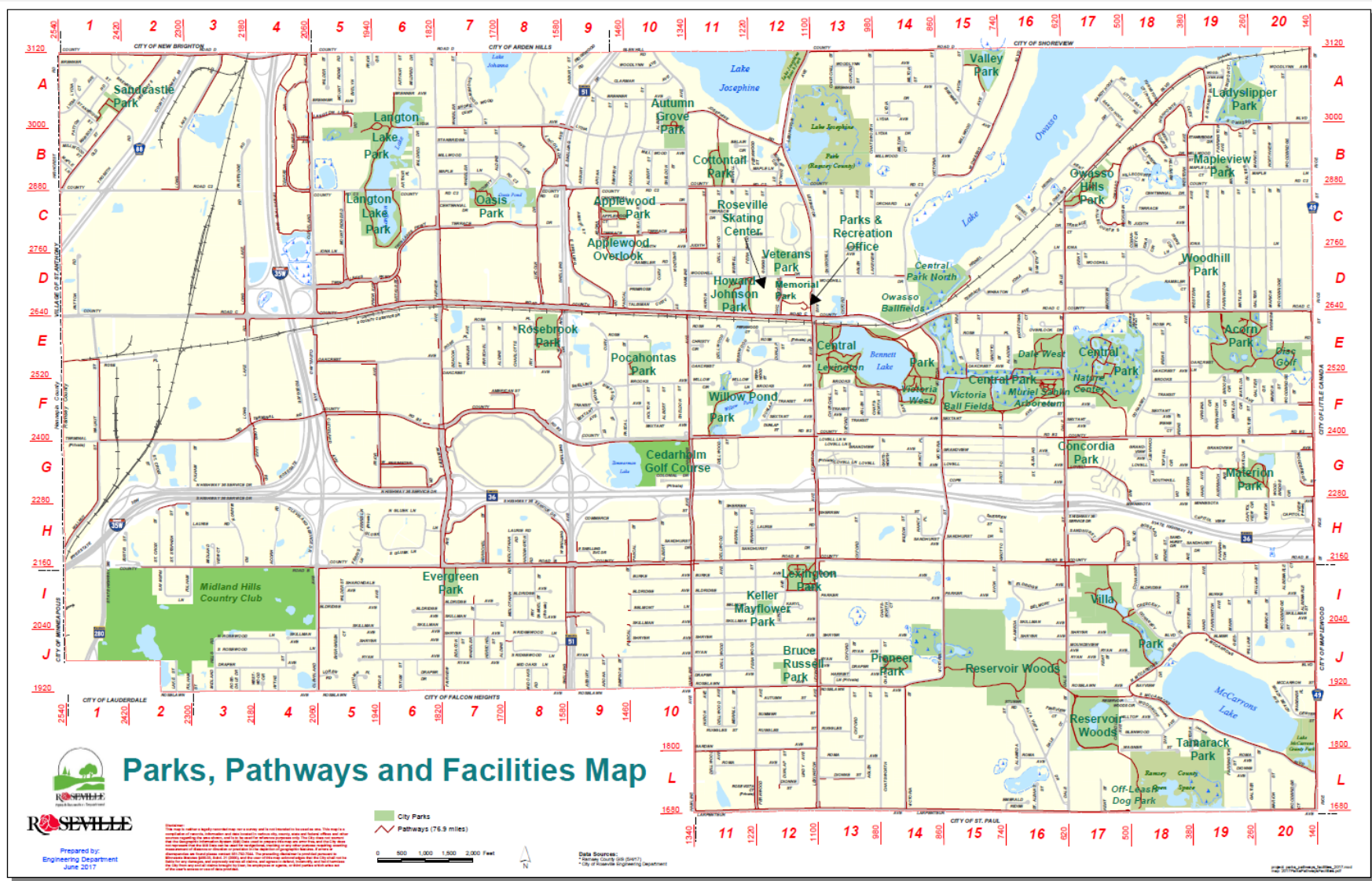
Background

- 2010 – adopted by the City Council
- Extensive public involvement
- Meet interests for today and future
- Identified a need for additional P/R opportunities in the SW Roseville

Constellation Concept



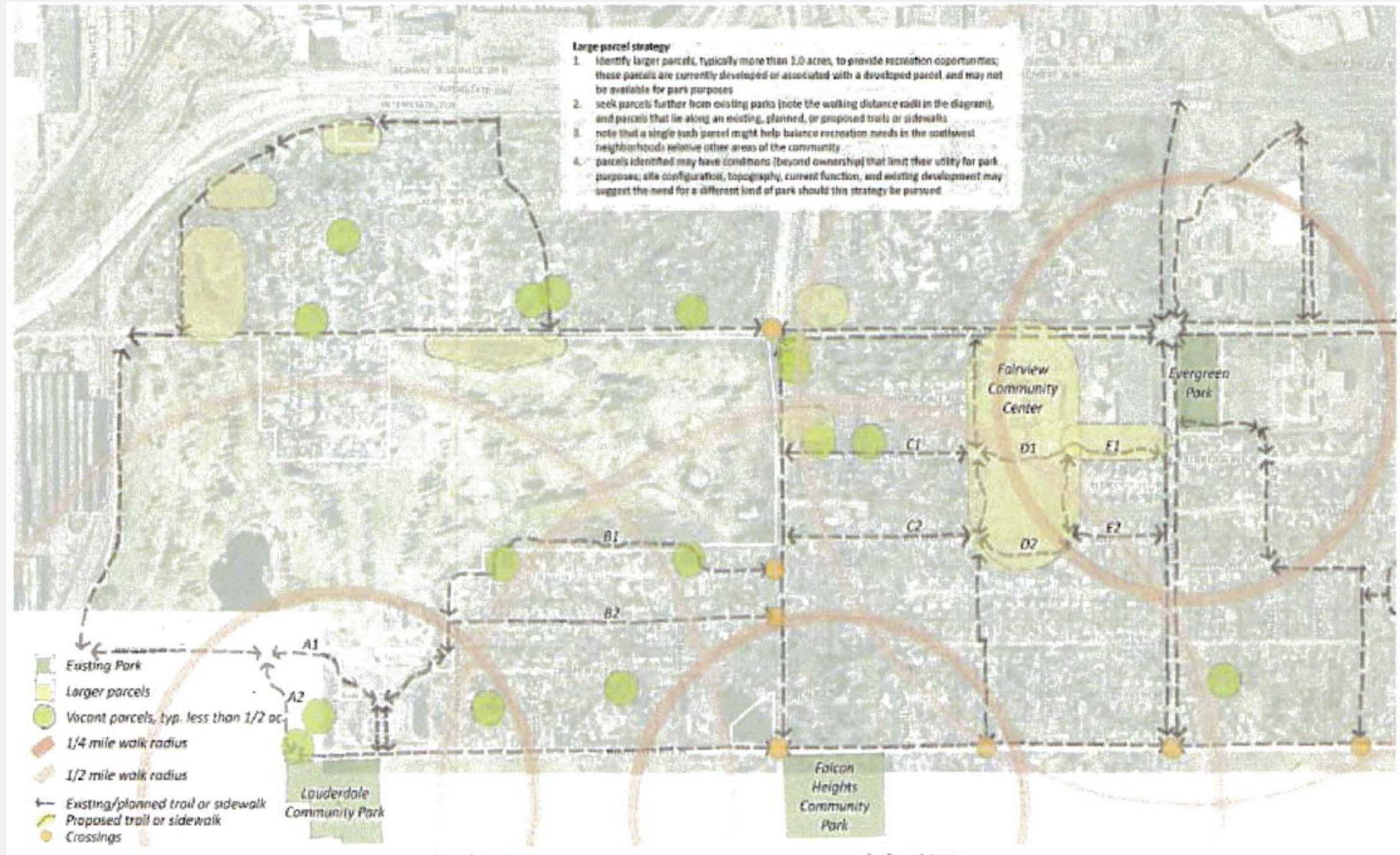
Parks and Facility Map



System Master Plan Identified Strategies

- Connectivity strategy – Use existing Roseville parks and parks in neighboring communities by extending trails and sidewalks to better link residents to recreation opportunities.
- Small parcel strategy – Identify small “vacant” parcels, typically less than 0.5 acres, to provide recreation opportunities.
- Large parcel strategy – Identify larger parcels, typically more than an 1.0 acre, to provide recreation opportunities.
- Combination

- Relatively small at .79 acres
- Utility Easement
- Play lot Classification – small parks intended for informal recreation, play and relaxation at the smallest level
