Federal law does not authorize the Roseville Police Department to enforce federal immigration laws. As such, employees shall not inquire about a person’s immigration status unless it is directly related to a criminal investigation.

Members of the department are authorized to assist ICE when it is related to scene safety and/or the safety of ICE employees as they perform their duties. Members of the department are authorized to cooperate with a task force involving ICE agents as long as the focus of the task force is not immigration enforcement.

Members of the department will cooperate with ICE as specifically mandated by federal and state laws.

Rights and Services for All Crime Victims

1. You have the right to apply for financial help for losses resulting from a violent crime. This assistance does not cover property losses. For application and information, call **651-201-7300**, TTY: 651-205-4827. Outside the Twin Cities area call **888-622-8799**, or go to the OJP Website: ojp.dps.mn.gov.
2. You have the right to request that the law enforcement agency withhold public access to data revealing your identity. The law enforcement agency will decide if this is possible.
3. You have the right, if an offender is charged, to be informed of and participate in the prosecution process, including the right to request restitution (money that is court-ordered from the offender and paid to the victim).

Rights of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Harassment Victims:

1. You can ask the city or county attorney to file a criminal complaint.
2. You have the right to be informed of a prosecutor's decision to decline prosecution or dismiss the case along with information about seeking an Order for Protection (OFP) or Harassment Restraining Order (HRO) at no cost. Orders are issued through District Court and may include:
 - a. an order restraining the abuser from further acts of abuse;
 - b. an order directing the abuser to leave your household;
 - c. an order preventing the abuser from entering your home (or a reasonable area around your home), school, business or place of employment;
 - d. an order awarding you or the other parent custody of/or visitation of your minor child or children; or
 - e. an order directing the abuser to pay support to you and the minor if the abuser has a court order to do so.
3. You have the right to protection against employer retaliation to take reasonable time off to attend order for protection or harassment restraining order proceedings
4. Domestic abuse victims have the ability to terminate a lease without penalty.
5. Sexual assault victims can make a confidential request for HIV testing of a convicted offender.
6. Sexual assault victims do not have to pay the cost of a sexual assault examination.
7. Sexual assault victims may not be required to undergo a polygraph examination in order for an investigation or prosecution to proceed.
