The Roseville Police Department is looking for the public's help with locating a suspect involved in a fatal hit and run crash. On July 30, 2019, Daniel Alexander Jennings was charged with failing to remain at the scene of a fatal collision ([Minn. Stat 169.09, subd. 1](#)). A felony warrant has been issued for his arrest.

On July 22, 2019 at 2:00 a.m., Roseville Police were dispatched to the 2500 block of Cleveland Avenue on a male and female arguing. Officers located a male lying in the southbound traffic lane of Cleveland Avenue with multiple life-threatening injuries resulting from being struck by a vehicle. Officers immediately provided emergency medical assistance; however, the male was pronounced dead at the scene. Officers located a female a few blocks away who said she and her boyfriend had been arguing and she walked away to calm down.

A semi-driver reported he was northbound on Cleveland Avenue when he saw the male lying in the southbound lane of Cleveland Avenue, near Oakcrest Avenue. He saw an SUV approaching southbound on Cleveland, so he honked his horn and flashed his lights to try to alert the other driver; however, the SUV ran over the male. The driver of the SUV initially stopped, but fled the scene without identifying himself as officers provided emergency medical care to the victim.

Through surveillance video and witness statements, officers located the SUV, a 1997 Chevrolet Tahoe, on July 23, 2019 at a nearby motel. A witness staying in the same motel room as the driver confirmed that Daniel Alexander Jennings struck someone the night before with his vehicle.

Jennings spoke with detectives on the phone and he admitted running something over in the area of Cleveland and Oakcrest on his way home from work. He stopped and learned from witnesses that he had struck a person. Jennings admitted leaving the scene as officers arrived and were providing emergency medical care to the victim. Jennings agreed to meet with detectives, but he never showed up. As of July 31, 2019, Jennings has yet to be located. Detectives are continuing to investigate.

The victim has been identified as Michael James Strong, a 23-year-old male from Minneapolis.
