Fall 2020 Event Schedule

September 12 - Tree Planting - Various Parks

Volunteers are needed across the park system to plant more than 100 new trees throughout the city. Trees will be planted as part of a grant to offset trees impacted by Emerald Ash Borer.

October 17 - Native Seed Harvest and Distribution - Muriel Sahlin Arboretum Volunteers will gather seed from native plants and spread them to another part of the park in an effort to expand the reach of native plants and grasses.

November 21- Savanna Restoration (Drag/Stack) - Central Park Participants will pull fallen or otherwise damaged trees and limbs from the Savanna on the north side of Bennett Lake to allow for greater vegetation growth and more aesthetic beauty.



December 19 - Drag and Stack - Villa Park

Participants will pull fallen or otherwise damaged trees and limbs from Villa Park to allow for greater vegetation growth and more aesthetic beauty.

In addition to the above events, volunteer led-events of all shapes and sizes will be run throughout the fall.
