RIGHT-OF-WAY PERMIT INFORMATION FOR ROLL-OFF CONTAINERS

This summary of right-of-way information has been created to be a helpful guide to Roseville's Right-of-Way permit process. For additional information, available at no charge, is the "City of Roseville Right-of-Way Management Ordinance Permits and Fees," "City of Roseville Ordinance No. 1209; Right-of-Way Management," and "Right-of-Way Ordinance Templates."

1. What is the Right-of-Way?

The Right-of-Way is the surface and space above and below a public roadway, highway, street, cartway, bicycle and public sidewalk in which the City has an interest, including other dedicated rights-of-way for transportation purposes, utility easements and any other real property owned by or under the control of the City.

2. What type of permit is needed?

Right-of-Way Non-excavation (Obstruction) Permit:

This permit is required for all work that would hinder free and open passage over any part of the right-of-way **overnight**. Failure to obtain a permit for this type of work will result in a fee 2 times the amount of the standard fee.

3. Permit Timetable:

A permit must be applied for prior to a roll-off container being placed in the right-of-way.

Roll-off containers will only be allowed in the right-of-way for up to 2 weeks.

The permit application must include the beginning and ending dates that the roll-off container will be placed in the right-of-way. If the container is not removed by the date provided, a supplemental application and fee for extension must be provided prior to that date. If there is no extension applied for, penalties apply.

4. Permit Fee:

The fee for a right-of-way permit for a roll-off container is \$50.00 per week.

Right-of-way permit fees have been established to comply with Minn. Stat. § 237.162 and § 237.163 and are made to recover out-of-pocket and projected costs of the City from persons using the public right-of-way.

5. Other requirements:

- a. For the safety of other users of roadway and right-of-way, roll-off containers must have reflectors.
- b. If any damage to roadway, curb or pathway occurs, the permit holder will be charged for restoration costs (for more information, see 6.0 of the "City of Roseville Right-of-Way Management Ordinance Permits and Fees.").
- c. Roll-off containers are not allowed on the streets between November 1 and March 31.
- d. Roll-off containers cannot be placed on roadways less than 28 feet wide.
- e. Any roll-off containers placed on right-of-way without a permit may be ticketed and removed.
