Upcoming Sewer Maintenance

A majority of the sewer mains in the City of Roseville were installed more than 50 years ago. The material used was clay pipe. Over the years, cracks have developed in the pipe due to tree roots and ground water. These cracks can create issues for the capacity of these sewers. Some sewer lines can be rehabilitated through “trenchless technology.”

During our routine televising of the city’s sewer mains, a segment of main on your road was identified as needing rehabilitation. The city has hired **Visu-Sewer, Inc.** to rehabilitate this pipe. Since this is a maintenance project, there will be no assessments for your property.

- **This newsletter is being sent to all property owners that live in the areas impacted.**
- **The work is anticipated to occur in phases:**
 - Pre-lining cleaning: January to April**
 - Lining: January to August**
- **When your sewer service is being disrupted during this work, the Contractor will notify you 24 hours in advance of that disruption.**

COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

The City of Roseville and the Contractor have modified our standard construction practices to limit exposure to the virus and impacts to residents during construction. The city will work with project contractors to follow workplace hygiene and social

distancing recommendations from the CDC and Minnesota Department of Health to slow the spread of COVID-19. Please practice social distancing with construction and field staff and contact city staff directly if you have any questions or concerns.

Service Disruption

When the contractor is working in your area, they will let you know by leaving a door hanger on your door at least 24 hours in advance of the work. They will request that you refrain using from running water for baths, showers, dishwashers and washing machines during the times indicated on the door hanger.

You can continue to use water for activities like washing your hands or flushing the toilet at all times.



SEWER UTILITY WORK

Dear Homeowner/Rental/Business Owner:

Visu-Sewer has been contracted to reline the mainline sanitary sewer that your property is connected to. Relining allows for renewing the existing sewer without the inconvenience of conventional digging and relaying. *During this work, your sewer lateral will be temporarily disconnected from the main sewer.* Relining is normally completed in one day, within two shifts. The first shift crew installs the liner. The second shift crew reconnects the building laterals to the new liner.

To avoid problems, we need your cooperation. Reduce possible odors by pouring approximately one gallon of water down each of your floor drains and basement sinks before the date/time listed below. If your sump pump flows into the sanitary sewer place damp cloth over the sump/crock. Use your toilet only if necessary and ***discontinue further use of all water including; washing machines, dish washers, bath tubs, showers, sinks and sump pumps (if hooked to sanitary sewer) on the following date:***

Process

The process will have an impact on your sewer service for up to one working day. The actual time is dependent upon site conditions, the length of the segment being repaired, and the quality of the existing pipe. Services will be restored at the end of the day so homes are not impacted overnight. The contractor will use existing sanitary sewer manholes to access the sewer pipes scheduled for rehabilitation.

Jetting and Cleaning

Before any actual lining work is done, the sewer line is jetted and cleaned with a high-pressure water hose. Grease and accumulated buildup is removed, and any tree roots intruding into the sewer line are cut and eliminated.
