13 14 15	SECTION 1: Title 5 Chapter 507 of the Roseville City Code is hereby amended as follows:

This area of the vehicle shall not include the trunk of the motor vehicle when such vehicle is equipped with a trunk or another area of the vehicle not normally occupied by the driver or passengers if the vehicle is not equipped with a trunk. A utility or glove compartment shall be deemed to be within the area occupied by the driver and passengers.

507.02 DRUG PARAPHERNALIA:

A. Definitions:

- 1. "Drug Paraphernalia" means all equipment, products and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use or designed for use, in planting, propagating, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance in violation of Minnesota Statutes chapter 152, which includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Kits used, intended for use or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing or harvesting of any species of plant which is a controlled substance or from which a controlled substance can be derived.
 - b. Kits used, intended for use or designed for use in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing or preparing controlled substances.
 - c. Isomerization devices used, intended for use or designed for use in increasing the potency of any species of plant which is a controlled substance.
 - d. Testing equipment used, intended for use or designed for use in identifying or in analyzing the strength, effectiveness or purity of controlled substances.
 - e. Scales and balances used, intended for use or designed for use in weighing or measuring controlled substances.

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f. Diluents and adulterants such as quinine hydrochloride, mannitol, mannite, dextrose and lactose used, intended for use or designed for use in cutting controlled substances.

206	A. Definitions.

208	1. For purposes of this section, the terms "cannabis flower," "cannabis
209	products," "lower-potency hemp edibles," and "hemp-derived consumer
210	products" shall have the definitions given to them in Minnesota
211	Statutes, section 342.01, as it may be amended from time to time.
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- 2. For purposes of this section, the terms "tobacco," "tobacco-related devices," and "electronic delivery device" shall have the definitions given to them in Minnesota Statutes, section 609.685, as it may be amended from time to time.
 - 3. For purposes of this section, "specified City properties" is defined as: all City parks, parking lots adjacent to City parks, and trails within City parks, and on the main city campus, including City Hall, the fire station, maintenance facility, skating center and oval, and adjacent parking lots, and the license center strip mall and adjacent parking lot.
 - 4. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 152.0263, subd. 5, "specified City properties" does not include the following: (i) a private residence, including the person's curtilage or yard; (ii) private property not generally accessible by the public; and (iii) the premises of an establishment or event licensed to permit on-site consumption of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles, or hemp-derived consumer products.
 - B. No person shall smoke or vape any product, including tobacco and tobacco-related products, cannabis flower, cannabis products, and hemp-derived consumer products, or use any tobacco related or electronic delivery devices at a specified City property. A violation of this section shall be a petty misdemeanor and is punishable in accordance with Chapter 102 of this Code.
 - SECTION 3: Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.
